

Family Talk—Preserving Truth

READ TOGETHER

Galatians 2:1–10

1. Has anyone ever told you something was true, but it didn't feel right?
2. How can we know God's truth so well that other people can't talk us out of it?

LIVE IT

Knowing the difference between the truth and lies around us can be hard. People may say it's okay to cheat if you don't get caught, or playing video games instead of doing your homework is okay because they make you happy. Instead of listening to what people say, we need to know what God has to say. We know cheating is wrong because God wants us to be honest ([Colossians 3:9](#)). Video games are fun, but God also wants us to take our work seriously ([Colossians 3:23](#)).

The most dangerous lies are the ones that get us to question who God is and what He's done for us. Jesus died on the cross for our sins and rose from the grave so we could have a relationship with God. In order to become part of God's family, we need to make Jesus the Lord of our lives and believe in our hearts that God raised Him from the dead to be saved ([Romans 10:9](#)). If anyone adds anything to that or takes away from it, we know it's not true because it isn't what God said in the Bible.

LEAN ON GOD

Dear God,

Thank You for loving us enough to die so we could become Your children. People confuse us sometimes, but You want us to know the truth. Help us listen to You, over anyone or anything else.
